Brian Osiek, 71, of Independence, MO passed away on Monday, April 27, 2026. Brian was born on November 17, 1954 to Eldred “Zeke” and Wilma Osiek. He grew up in Independence alongside his brother, Steve, and graduated from Truman High School in 1972.

Brian began working in the parts department for a Ford dealership while still in high school and remained in that line of work throughout his entire career. Through hard work and dedication, he worked his way up and spent much of his career as a Parts Manager. For the last 13 years he had been employed with Bob Sight Ford in the parts department, where he valued the people he worked with and took pride in doing his job well.
