



## Chase Randall Curtis

Chase Randall Curtis, 30, of Kansas City, MO died on Sunday, October 26, 2025, following a long illness with liver disease at Saint Luke's Hospital Plaza. He was a loving son, brother, uncle, nephew and friend surrounded by his family and many childhood friends.

Chase was born on June 14, 1995. As a young boy he loved football, baseball, karate, fishing, boating, skateboarding and all outdoor sports. He grew up a life-long Kansas City Chief's fan. He enjoyed attending games over the years with his Dad, Uncle Dan, Uncle Steve and cousin Logan. He graduated from Grandview High School in 2013. Immediately following, he received his fork-lift certification, which led him to be part of the team that built the new KCI Airport. He also held jobs as a traveling telecommunications tower climber and an electrician.

Chase's last act of giving was to serve as an organ donor. He has already saved two young men with his kidneys. His heart valves, corneas, and skin/bone tissue will enhance and impact many more lives.
