July 23, 1948 - August 10, 2018

Daniel “Jerry” Sage came into this world on July 23, 1948 in Fillmore, Utah; he left it behind on August 10, 2018 at his daughter’s home in Lenexa, KS.

Daniel was a zeitgeist, his experiences and life echoing the 70 years which he walked this Earth. He would split his adolescent years between the rural farming community in which he was born and the urban Salt Lake City.

Embodying the young 50s rebel while attending West High and developing a love for hunting and fishing in the mountains and valleys surrounding Fillmore.

At the age of 17 he would join the army, seeing both the center of the Cold War in West Berlin, while guarding the final Nazi prisoner at Spandau, and fierce fighting while serving in Vietnam. Upon leaving the army and returning

to the states Daniel would once again draw upon the spirit of his age and find himself a hippie. Trying to turn people on to a more loving way of life. As the

seventies flowed into the eighties Daniel would find himself raising a family and running a successful business in southern Utah. During the next few

decades life would lead back to Salt Lake City and then onto Kansas City. The path of life is rarely smooth and even and while Daniel would traverse many a rough path, he never lost his love of family and pursuit of truth.

Above is but a small outline of a brave and daring life, laid between each line are a myriad of stories and tales that made the man whom we all knew and
