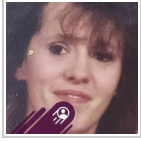
She was preceded in death by her parents, Goldie and Joel Dunlap, and her sister, Margaret Sapp.

Fannie will be cremated, and a celebration of her life will be determined at a later time.

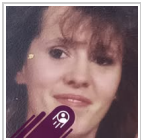

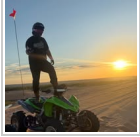
