Jeff Davis passed in November, at Truman Lakewood Hospital, where he was a resident, after experiencing a massive stroke in April of 2018. He had been a resident of the Kansas City Metropolitan area his whole life. He is survived by his brother, Brian K. Davis, and sister Cheryl A. Davis, as well as nephews Nicholas and Nathan Davis and his former wife Lorri Gaddy.

He was preceded in death by his mother Shirley S. Davis and father, John C. Davis, Jr. As well, as his beloved pet dog, Buddy.

Born and raised in South Kansas City, Missouri, he was a lifelong Boy Scout, achieving the honor of Eagle Scout. He then went on to find his passion for motorcycles at a young age, as a teenager in the 1960s. He graduated from Ruskin High School in 1972, where he played football and drove a Gold Irid 1970 Dodge Coronet SuperBee, 440 six-pack.

He went on to become a lifelong Motorsports mechanic, working with some of the most talented people and on some of the fastest bikes in the local industry. He was a very well-known, well-versed, encyclopedic motorcycle technician, with numerous certifications and achievements over the years from all of the major manufacturers. He spent his entire life both working on and riding the motorcycles he loved, as well as anything else that went fast.
