Karen Sue Beshore, 72, of Claycomo MO, passed away on Thursday, October 24, 2024 in her home. She is survived by her two daughters, Crystal Beshore (partner Joe O'Conner) of Nevada and Amber Daskaleas (partner Brent Koerner) of Kansas City; eight grandchildren, Darren Williams (wife Taylor), Dakota Williams (wife Brittany), Nathan Pryor, Noah Beshore, Ryan Koerner, Katie Wyatt (husband Nevin), Athena Daskaleas, and Aristotle Daskaleas; three great-grandchildren, Myla Williams, Quincy Wyatt, and Valyn Wyatt; two furbabies Isis and Freya; and many friends and loved ones.

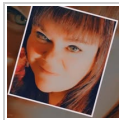
