Kurt Nabity, 50, of Stilwell, Kansas, died Tuesday, January 28th at Centerpoint Hospital in Independence, Missouri.

A memorial service will be at 2 PM Saturday at St. Mary Magdalene Episcopal Church in Belton, MO. An interment service will be held in Grand Island, Nebraska at a later date.
