Peggy Jo (Robertson) Collins, 65, of Lansing, Kansas, passed away on February 23, 2025, after a valiant fight with cancer. Peggy was born at Olathe Hospital on December 12, 1959, to William Lee Robertson and Ruby Gladys Robertson. She graduated from Olathe High School in 1977 and started working at King Radio Corporation in Olathe early the following year. It was there she met James (Jim) R. Collins II, the man she would spend the rest of her life with. Peggy and Jim were married on December 28, 1979, and spent the next 45+ years together.

Peggy worked a variety of jobs early in her marriage. But the bulk of her working years were spent at Armed Forces Insurance in Leavenworth, where she worked as an Issue Processor, from July of 1990 until her retirement in December of 2019.

Peggy had a love for traveling and took many trips with Jim, both across and out of the country. Her adventurous spirit was nourished through cave-diving in Mexico (her favorite destination), jet-skiing in Jamaica, parasailing in Branson, and numerous other trips. Despite her zeal for travel, Peggy found her greatest joy in spending time with her two granddaughters.

She is preceded in death by her parents, William and Ruby Robertson, brother Earl Robertson, and sister Mary Robertson. She is survived by her brother Dale Robertson, 72, her husband Jim, 67, daughter Dana Nicole Collins, 42, son Ian Michael Collins, 38, granddaughters Claire Lorraine Collins, 14, and Eleanor Gloria Collins, 11, and several beloved nieces and nephews.
