Sheryl Lynn (Stringham) Giebler, 71, of Louisburg, KS, passed away on May 24, 2025. She was born on October 5, 1953 in Paola, KS to James (Jim) O. and Laverne C. (Prothe) Stringham. She was very attached to her two cats, Mitzi and Linus, and treasured them like they were her grandchildren.
