William (Bill) Larimer, age 61, a longtime resident of Camden Point, Missouri, died unexpectedly at St. Luke's North Hospital Kansas City, surrounded by his family.

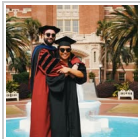

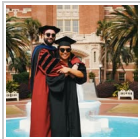
